



Frequently Asked Questions

When can I apply?

Prospective students must submit an application the spring semester prior to their intended fall semester start date. There is a priority deadline of **January 15th** every application cycle.

How do I apply to the undergraduate dental hygiene program at the Adams School of Dentistry?

Current UNC-Chapel Hill Students: You may request and complete an application through your Connect Carolina portal.

Transfer Students: You may submit an application through the Common Application portal making sure to use the [transfer student version](#).

How many students do you accept?

The dental hygiene program admits 24 undergraduate students for each incoming class. We accept one class per academic year. New classes begin matriculation in August of each year.

Can I set up an appointment to review my transcript with an admission counselor?

We are always happy to help clarify our requirements for prospective students. If you're admitted to Carolina, the Office of Undergraduate Admission will do a course-by-course analysis of all your coursework and give you a complete report before our enrollment deadline. We're sorry that we're unable to do this for prospective students until after admission. It's critical that we apply the most current rules to your situation, and these may change from now until the time in which you decide to apply and enroll.

I am a current dental hygienist; do you offer a degree completion program to receive the BSDH?

At this time, the dental hygiene program does not offer a degree completion program. We encourage you to visit the [ADHA website](#) to find a program that fits your needs.

The dental hygiene degree completion program no longer matriculates students for completion of a Bachelor of Science in dental hygiene degree as of 2017.

Do you offer an online BSDH or Post-Certificate program?

At this time, the dental hygiene program does not offer any online program options.

Can I finish my prerequisite courses or degree requirement (AA/AS) after I begin the dental hygiene program?

No, all prerequisite requirements must be completed by enrollment. All required degrees (AA/AS) must be granted prior to enrollment. Failure to comply may result in rescinding a previous admissions decision.

I took the science prerequisites more than five years ago. Do I need to retake them?

At this time, there are no time restrictions or expiration dates on prerequisite courses for our program.* Please review the grade recommendation statement for more information.

My GPA is not where I want it to be, can/should I still apply?

Yes! Applicants will be considered for admissions under a holistic review process. All portions of the application are evaluated and taken into consideration by all members of the admissions committee. No one is automatically admitted or denied because of a single number. The average college GPA of incoming dental hygiene students last year was above a 3.0.

I am a high school student, or I have never attended college and I want to earn my BSDH from UNC-Chapel Hill. What should I do first?

You should contact the UNC-Chapel Hill Office of Undergraduate Admissions to obtain information about admission to the university. Your first two years of study will be devoted to completing general education requirements and dental hygiene prerequisites. All prospective students can apply during their sophomore year.

I already have a bachelor's degree or have attended college before and want to apply to the dental hygiene program to pursue my Bachelor of Science in dental hygiene, where do I start?

The Dental Hygiene Program will allow students to receive an additional bachelor's degree.

Even if you have attended college you can still be accepted into the program as long as you satisfy the [admissions requirements](#). If you last attended an institution that was not UNC-Chapel Hill, you would follow the transfer application steps to apply.

I have received a degree in dentistry from another country or received a certificate from an accredited dental assisting school will I be able to receive credit for courses for classes if accepted into the program?

No. The UNC-Chapel Hill dental hygiene curriculum requires completion of all courses and does not accept transfer credits from previous dental hygiene coursework or other programs.

How many classes will I take each semester? How many hours per day will I attend class? Can I study part-time?

Classes and clinics for the dental hygiene program can be scheduled Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Students enroll on average in 15 credit hours per semester. Please refer to our curriculum overview.

Pursuing the Bachelor of Science in dental hygiene requires a full-time enrollment for the four semesters it takes to complete the program. Currently, we do not offer a part time enrollment option.

Will I be able to work full-time while attending the dental hygiene program?

Most dental hygiene students find the demands of attending courses and clinics far too rigorous to incorporate full-time employment into their daily schedules. However, it is up to the discretion of each individual student how to allocate their time outside of the dental hygiene program.

Can I submit more than 3 letters of recommendation? What should be included in letters of recommendation?

Yes. While our program only requires three letters, you may submit additional letters if you believe they are essential in our understanding of you as an applicant and enhance your application.

Letters can discuss the applicant's character, academic ability and skills that a recommender believes will enhance the overall application of an applicant. They may also provide context for a student detailing extracurricular activity involvement or extenuating circumstances that have made a student stand out to the recommender.



When should I expect my admissions decision letter?

Admissions Decision are released mid- to late-April every application cycle.

Do you have a waitlist?

Yes, we do have a waitlist. Your admission decision letter will indicate if they have been admitted, denied or waitlisted. Waitlisted students will be notified if a space becomes available in the program. No information is released regarding position on the waitlist or the number of students placed on the waitlist. If spaces do not become available, the waitlist does not carry over to the following term. Waitlisted applicants must submit a new application to be considered for admission for a future term.

I applied to the dental hygiene program, but I was denied. What can I do? UNC-Chapel Hill is my dream school.

All decisions for the dental hygiene program are final. Admissions is a competitive process and not all who apply can be accepted. Denied applicants are welcomed and encouraged to strengthen their application and apply during the next application cycle to be reconsidered for admission.

I am currently a UNC-Chapel Hill student would like to complete my current major/minor. Is this possible?

Yes. You can maintain/complete any previous majors or minors. Most student decide to complete additional majors/minors if they have less than 12 hours remaining. These courses can only be taken during summer sessions or your final semester prior to graduation. All students are required to meet with their assigned Academic Advisor in order to develop a plan.

Is financial aid available?

Yes. All financial aid is processed by the University's [Office of Student Scholarship and Student Aid](#). The dental hygiene program is still an undergraduate program within the University and financial aid will be processed as such.

Does your program require students to purchase instruments on their own?

No. The Adams School of Dentistry supplies clinical instruments for student use during their time at the school. Students are charged for this service through tuition and fees.
